

SAFE ROUTES to SCHOOL

A plan to make walking and biking to school a safe, fun activity

PROGRAMS NON-INFRASTRUCTURE RECOMMENDATIONS



OPEN STREETS

What: Open Streets events temporarily close major thoroughfares to car traffic and open them up for residents, visitors, local businesses, and others to walk, bike, roll, play and experience their street in a new way.

Who: City of Zumbrota, local law enforcement



BIKE DRIVE

What: A bike drive is an event where bicycles are donated, collected, repaired, and given away to students who need them. They can be hosted by the school district, law enforcement, or other community group.

Who: Zumbrota-Mazeppa SRTS Committee, SHIP



WALK+BIKE DAYS

What: Walk and Bike to School Day is an international event that celebrates and encourages active trips to school. Minnesota celebrates Walk/Bike to School Day in October, February, and May.

Who: Mazeppa-Zumbrota Schools, school staff



WALK+BIKE FIELD TRIPS

What: Field trips made by walking or biking give students a supportive environment to practice their pedestrian safety or bicycling skills. Destinations could vary, or the field trip could be the ride or walk itself.

Who: School staff, youth leadership groups



SLOW ROLL

What: A Slow Roll is a fun, safe, and inclusive bike ride for people of all ages and skill levels. The goal of a Slow Roll is to meet people, explore, and be outside.

Who: Zumbrota-Mazeppa SRTS Committee, SHIP, law enforcement



STUDENT VALET

What: Students, teachers, or volunteers trained to assist with drop-off and pick-up procedures can help standardize and expedite the process. It can help discourage idling and other bad behavior.


Who: School staff, youth leadership groups, volunteers

INFRASTRUCTURE NETWORK RECOMMENDATIONS

HIGH PRIORITY RECOMMENDATIONS

These locations are identified as high priorities for infrastructure improvement:

- A** Reduce roadway width with road reconstruction, install curb extensions and ADA curb ramps.
- B** Reduce roadway width with road reconstruction, install curb extensions and ADA curb ramps.
- C** Reduce roadway width with road reconstruction, install curb extensions and ADA curb ramps.
- D** Install curb extensions, high visibility crosswalks, and ADA ramps. Reduce roadway width and turning radii.
- E** Replace guardrail. Explore additional landscaping and beautification.
- F** Install curb extensions, ADA ramps, high visibility crosswalk markings, and school signage.
- G** Install curb extensions and flashing beacon. Widen crosswalk markings.
- H** Widen crosswalk markings. Install flashing beacon, crosswalk signage and advance signage.
- I** Install ADA curb ramps, marked crosswalk, and school crossing signage.
- J** Widen bridge and fence access, clear foliage, install lighting and gateway treatment.
- K** Replace and extend trail. Install curb and gutter and/or planted buffer and additional lighting.
- L** Install curb extensions and/or median islands and ADA ramps throughout corridor. Fill sidewalk gaps.
- M** Install curb extensions and/or median islands and ADA ramps throughout corridor. Fill sidewalk gaps.
